Pastor's Message

THE REASON FOR LENT

Is God real, is the Bible history? This has been the issue for many people throughout history. That was the meaning behind the question the devil asked Eve in the garden. Is God true and is His Word truth? Eve and Adam were deceived into believing God's Word was not true and ate the forbidden fruit.

Immediately they both knew God's Word is true and they were under condemnation. So they hid themselves in the garden. God looked for them to confess their sin. But they refused to confess, Adam blamed God, Eve blamed the devil. God cursed the devil, Adam and Eve as well as all creation. Still God promised to restore His creation through His Son.

Forward many generations to the time of Noah and his family. Evil is everywhere. Genesis 6:5 "The Lord saw the wickedness of man was great in the earth, and that every intention of his thoughts in his heart was only evil continually." There was one man not like the rest, his name Noah.

Noah and his family believed in God and the truth of God's Word. One day God spoke to Noah to instruct him to build an ark and what would happen. Noah in faith believed God and with his sons built the ark according to God's instructions. Believing God and trusting God's Word was not popular with anyone else. The months Noah needed to build the ark were months Noah preached the truth of God's Word.

Sadly, only Noah and his family believed God's Word and the destruction to come. As God instructed Noah, so it happened. As the waters began to cover the earth God shut the door to the

Jesus of Nazareth is God's Son, His name means the Lord saves. Jesus lived the perfect life in our place, then died the death we deserve to die. On the third day Jesus was raised to life eternal. God accepted His sacrifice on the cross in full payment for the sins of all people, past, present, and future.

When we look at our lives through the Ten Commandments with the help of the Holy Spirit, we realize we have not kept them throughout our lives. We have not always placed God first in our lives. We have misused the Lord's name not only in our words but also in our thoughts. We have not placed a priority on hearing and learning God's Word gladly as we should.



I remind you the words of Jesus recorded in Matthew 24 about His return in glory: "But concerning that day and that hour, no one knows, not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. For as were the days of Noah, so will be the coming of the Son of Man. For as in those days before the flood, they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day when Noah entered the ark, and they were unaware until the flood came and swept them all away, so will be the coming of the Son of Man."

The season of Lent is a time of reflection on God's Word of truth. In the waters of Holy Baptism God has adopted you to be His child. Through your parents, pastors and Sunday school teachers, God has shared His Word with you. In the Lord's Supper God has given you Christ's body and blood to forgive your sins and to strengthen you in the faith.

When we look outside the Christian Church, we see life in this world much like life in the days of Noah. The children of God are a minority. Christians are ridiculed and mocked for living the faith. But be certain, the Day is coming when Christ will return in glory and it will be too late to then turn to God for grace. God's grace is here now through God's Word and Sacraments. May God continue to hold you in His grace through the work of the Holy Spirit in God's Word and Sacraments to be forgiven in the blood of Christ shed on His cross for you as you wait for the coming of Christ Jesus in glory on the Last Day. In Jesus' name. Amen

Speaking of Jesus / Writing of Jesus

Restrain, O Lord, the human pride
That seeks to thrust Your truth aside
Or with some man-made thoughts or things
Would dim the words Your Spirit sings.

(verse 5 of LSB 585 text by Philipp Melanchton) author of the Augsburg Confession friend and collaborator of Martin Luther

As LWMLC members, we are often asked to do a presentation or write an article. It may be only a short note of encouragement or a devotional we have been asked to write up. Have you stared at that blank sheet of paper and asked, "Where do I start"? What is my topic/purpose?

Our pastor did a presentation on this subject. We learned how we need to speak of Jesus to others and how to write of Jesus when this is asked of us. He said you should ask yourself, who am I? What are my vocations? Vocation means calling, so who am I? Perhaps a parent, grandparent, spouse, friend (especially through the sharing of suffering). He cautioned that when you do not speak according to your vocation (calling), you are on shaky ground.

Praying is a blessed thing. God commands and invites believers in Jesus Christ to pray.

Matthew 11:28 "Come to Me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest."

Philippians 4:6 "Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God."

You are on firm ground when you quote the Bible (Scripture). We are hearing directly from God. The basis of all Lutheran teachings is the Bible. We confess that the only authority for Christian teaching and life which never errs or leads us

astray is God's Word, which He has given to us in the Old and New Testament Scriptures (the Bible).

Where do you get your script? Immerse yourself in Scripture, and you'll find your script. Start with scripture. It is appropriate to speak what God has said. Be careful not to 'shoe horn' God's Word into what you want to say. Rather, let God's Word 'shoe horn' what you say. Let His Word be the light that guides you.

When speaking or writing of Jesus - consider how you would speak to a friend. Your write up may be well intentioned to encourage but where is Jesus? Have you proclaimed His saving work of the Gospel – i.e. salvation in Jesus' name?

Decide: What is my topic? My purpose? My text? Study your text in the context of the chapter to clarify what the text is saying. Remember we are not alone; our pastors will help if we ask. We are submitted to the Lord in what He has said. Let God speak for Himself.

Psalm 19:14 "Let the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be acceptable in Your sight, O Lord, my Rock and my Redeemer."



I Heard The Voice of Jesus Calling



"He who dwells in the shelter of the Most High will abide in the shadow of the Almighty. I will say to the LORD, "My refuge and my fortress, my God, in whom I trust." Psalm 91:1–2

Whenever I enter the season of Lent, I feel a bit of hesitation in my body and spirit. Am I really up for this season of repentance and renewal? Wouldn't it be easier to just sit it out this year? When I open myself to God's call in this way, something painful always rises to the surface. Martin Luther was familiar with this pattern and reminds us that the devil is a tricky creature who can't stand our faithfulness to God. When we seek God and resist the lies of the world, we can expect those lies to fight back. Today's psalm, with its reminders of God's faithfulness, is a comfort for us as we enter Lent. Take heart! Neither the lies of the world nor the painful truths you uncover can hurt you when the Lord is your refuge and fortress. "Those who love me, I will deliver; I will protect those who know my Name."

The familiar hymn for Lent, "I Heard the Voice of Jesus Say," is an invitation. Jesus says to us today: "Come and rest your weary self. Come and find refreshment for your body and soul. Come, follow me." This invitation from our Lord is for us, exactly as we are. Jesus is inviting us, to put down your burdens and to come and find rest in Him, to come and drink deeply of the fresh water of the Spirit, and to follow where his light would lead us, one step at a time.

Take a moment today to lean on this good news: We are not alone. Our struggles are not unseen. We are beloved of God, who shines the light of life onto our path. Be not afraid. Step forth in courage!

Let us pray: Lord Jesus, come to our aid. Give us courage in the face of tasks you've given us, and protect us against the forces that keep us from you. We trust in you. We turn our hearts to you. Let us recognize our own name spoken in your voice. Oh God, give us the rest, refreshment, and light that we long for. Amen.

Our committee has been quiet lately, with no grant requests. However, we are busy keeping in touch with our camps and coming up with ideas for the mite challenges. I have spoken to Lavinia Henderson of Camp Lutherland and to Heather Chony and Rev. Brian Falkenholt from Camp Aurora about the requests for mattresses and water system, respectively. Lavinia reports that Lutherland will be making a choice soon from which business to purchase the mattresses. Therefore, I am expecting some grant requests to be coming in soon, so please keep the mites coming! As well, keep praying and finding a way to support our 3 Lutheran Camps this summer!

This winter, we focussed on the "Great Water Challenge" for Camp Aurora. This spring, we will focus on the Technology grant from Edmonton Seminary. For the "Great Technology Challenge", let's consider the number of computers or devices in our households. Donate \$1 for each cell phone or notepad, or \$5 for every laptop/computer, or consider how much time is spent a day/week and pay \$1 for every hour (your free time not work time!) that you are playing on it. Donate \$1 for each phone in your house. These are some challenge ideas, and if you have more, then we welcome them, as well as your news on your mite challenges! We will focus on this mission project for the spring, then let's take the summer off to enjoy God's creation and beauty on Earth and in the heavens! Here is a prayer for the Technology grant:

Dear Heavenly Father: we thank You for the gift of Concordia Lutheran Seminary in Edmonton, and for its professors, assistants and students who are eager to learn more about You and Your Word, and to share it. Some students and professors aren't able to come to the seminary to learn or to teach, and so the seminary tries to reach out to them to share Your Word. Thank You, Lord, for allowing us to help the seminary with providing the means and technology to teach and to reach and to share with others about You and Your promises, love and salvation for all. Just as Jesus travelled from village to village and preached from the mountaintops and from the fishing boats, so may we teach of Jesus as we provide the means for our seminarians, pastors, deacons/deaconesses to reach others about You. We would like to wish everyone a healthy, happy 2020.




