How does God help us?


(Ask your family what their answer is, too)

ENTRANCE INTO JERUSALEM IN JOHN 12.




Psalm Reading: read Psalm 118:19-29

Second Reading: read Philippians 2:5-11


PHILIPPIANS 2 REMINDS US WHAT A GREAT GOD WE HAVE.


In our second reading we read that Jesus humbled himself, taking the form of a _____ (v.7)
